The High School Diploma Program is a **FREE** independent study program. Prospective students, with all previous high school transcripts, first schedule a meeting with a counselor at www.oxnardadulted.us. Students can also scan any of the QR Codes below to arrange an appointment. After the meeting with the counselor, students will meet with their assigned teacher for course assignments. Students can work online, in the classroom or a combination of both. Instructors monitor students closely with lessons and exams, as well as tutoring in problem subject areas. Students usually work on one class at a time and work at their own pace. Textbooks can be purchased or borrowed with a deposit at the school office for home use. This course offers continuous enrollment throughout the school year.

High School Equivalency Test - HiSET®

The High School Equivalency Test (HiSET[®]) allows students to earn a California state issued High School Equivalency Certificate. The HiSET® High School Equivalency Certificate is considered the equivalent of a High School Diploma and is recognized throughout the United States, Canada, and Puerto Rico. Most employers, community colleges and vocational schools accept it in place of a high school diploma. The fee for the HiSET is \$150 which includes all 5 subject area tests: Reading, Writing, Math, Science and Social Studies. The fee to retake a failed subject area test is \$20. Tests can be retaken twice in a calendar year. There is a rescheduling fee of \$10 for each HiSET test. Rescheduling can only be done in the front office at least five working days before each test rescheduled. Please bring your original paperwork and an ID when requesting to reschedule a test. All testing fees must be paid at the Oxnard Adult School main campus in cash or credit/debit card (Visa, Master Card) only. **Registration:** Examinees must be 18 years or older or within 60 days of their 18th birthday if any of the parents or a quardian gives consent.

Examinees must be 18 years or older or within 60 days of their 18th birthday if any of the parents or a guardian gives consent. Examinees must not be US high school graduates; must have a valid email address and a valid ID (CA Driver's license or ID, military ID, passport or international government ID with current picture). There are no refunds on test fees.

- To schedule an exam, you must go online to create your profile. hiset.org > LogIn / Create myHiSET Account > Select your State > My HiSET Sign In > Create Account After you create your profile, print out the page with your HiSET ID number.
- Name on ID <u>must</u> be identical to the name on registration (excluding accents). If it doesn't, you may not be allowed to test, or your scores may be canceled after you take the test.
- Bring printed HiSET page and a valid ID, which can be California ID, DL, military ID, passport or any ID issued by a government to Oxnard Adult School Office and register for the HiSET Exam. No phone photos. Originals only. No drinks or snacks allowed in the testing room.

Registered Pharmacy Technician

This 240-hour PTCB* recognized program consists of theory and clinical preparation for employment in a pharmaceutical setting. Topics include: medical terminology, anatomy and physiology, pharmaceutical settings, duties and responsibilities of a pharmacy technician, pharmaceutical terms, abbreviations and symbols; metric and apothecary systems, record-keeping, dispensing prescriptions, and the manufacturing and labeling of drug products. Successful course completion qualifies students to apply to the California Board of Pharmacy for a Registered Pharmacy Technician license.

To enroll, a student must be 18 years of age or older and must have a US high school diploma or HSE certificate (GED or HiSET) to qualify for Registered Pharmacy Technician license. Candidates must be able to speak, read, and write English fluently.

Externships follow completion of course. Live scan required. No felony convictions. Students may be drug tested at externship site. National exam prerequisites: High School Diploma or equivalency; no felony convictions. Additional fee of \$129 (as of June 2022)

Certified Nursing Assistant (CNA)

Students will learn the basic nursing skills and procedures for providing quality patient care at the bedside of acutely or chronically ill persons in a hospital, skilled nursing facility or home setting. Classroom instruction and clinical training include resident care skills, vital signs, nutrition, emergency procedures, and rehabilitation. Upon completion of this course, students must take the state exam for certification. This course is approved by the California Department of Public Health (CDPH) and meets Title 22 regulations. For additional certification information, please refer to the licensing board at www.CDPH.ca.gov.

Clinical Requirements: Must be 18 years or older and speak, read, and write English. A passing score on the CNA entrance exam is required. A Social Security or tax ID number, background check, medical exam, vaccinations (including Covid-19), drug screening, government-issued picture ID, CPR, and TB test are mandatory for clinical externships at partner facilities. Students must be able to lift 50 pounds with good body mechanics. Drug screening may be required during the program. Other clinical requirements may exist.

FREE CNA Training

California has the largest number of older adults in the country, and it is projected an additional 275,000 direct care workers will be needed by 2026 to meet the growing population. Certified Nurse Assistants (CNAs) and Home Health Aides (HHAs) are a critical part of this workforce. In California, over 50% of CNAs work in nursing care facilities or community care facilities serving older adults. CNAs and HHAs play an essential role in these facilities and in home and community-based settings, often serving as the principal caregivers and having the most personal contact with residents than any other staff member or family member.

LeadingAge California® was awarded over \$25 million by the California Department of Health Access and Information (HCAI) to implement The Gateway-In Project© which will add 2,700 Certified Nurse Assistants and Home Health Aides to the workforce pipeline through training and job placement.

By providing training, wrap-around supports and incentives for career development for those entering or already in the field, the program will make significant headway in turning the tides on the ongoing workforce shortage crisis pervading the health care workforce that supports older adults across the state.



Oxnard Adult School is an accredited high school and post-secondary institution approved by the Western Association of Schools and Colleges and is authorized to issue high school diplomas and proficiency certificates. All courses offered are approved by the Oxnard Union High School District Board of Trustees and the California State Department of Education. Nursing classes are accredited by the State of California. It is the policy of the Oxnard Union High School District to serve students irrespective of ethnic group, religion, age, color, sex, physical or mental disability, as per Title IX regulations.
